Based on the Daily Bible Readings and theme for this week, who do you know that is feeling fearful? How can you help them?
Prayer is an important spiritual practice for

Christians. Lent is a season of the church year when we focus on prayer. This Lenten season,

take time to focus on the prayer Jesus taught us to pray, the Lord's Prayer (Luke 11:2-4). This first week in Lent we reflect on "Father, hallowed be your name" (v. 2a). Draw an outline of a cross on a sheet of paper. Write verse 2a at the top of the paper around the outside of the cross. Take a moment to think or talk about what this verse means to you. Place the cross in a visible place in your home to use as a devotional focus during Lent. Each week, another verse will be added around the cross.
