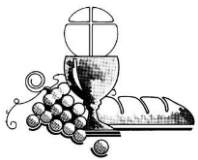

SERMON

"This is the Life – Called to Follow"

. . . Rev. Jon Zehnder

Sermon Outline

1. The one word that is most synonymous with salvation in the New Testament is - LIFE.
2. The Gospel is John 3:16 – that God so loved that world that He gave His only begotten Son Jesus, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have eternal life!
 - The Gospel has to do with God's grace
 - It is that, but it's not just that – it is also about life in all its fullness right here and now.
3. We are alive in Christ! It is now possible to live the kind of life for which we were made as we are empowered by the Holy Spirit,

4. There has been a change in our circumstances, we can now live in God's kingdom – with Him ruling in grace in our heart and life.
5. There is a critical distinction, in our life in Jesus, between training and trying.
6. Spiritual discipline or training is any practice, relationship or experience that will help us to continue to grow or mature or receive the strength that we need in order to live a kingdom life.
7. Every moment of our life is a chance to put ourselves in a place where we can receive power from God to live our life for Jesus.
8. Which leads us to 2 important questions:
 - 1st, what are the barriers that keep me from kingdom life?
 - 2nd, to look at ourselves and ask, “What can help me overcome those barriers?”

9. “Let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us, fixing our eyes on Jesus...”
Heb 12:1-2
