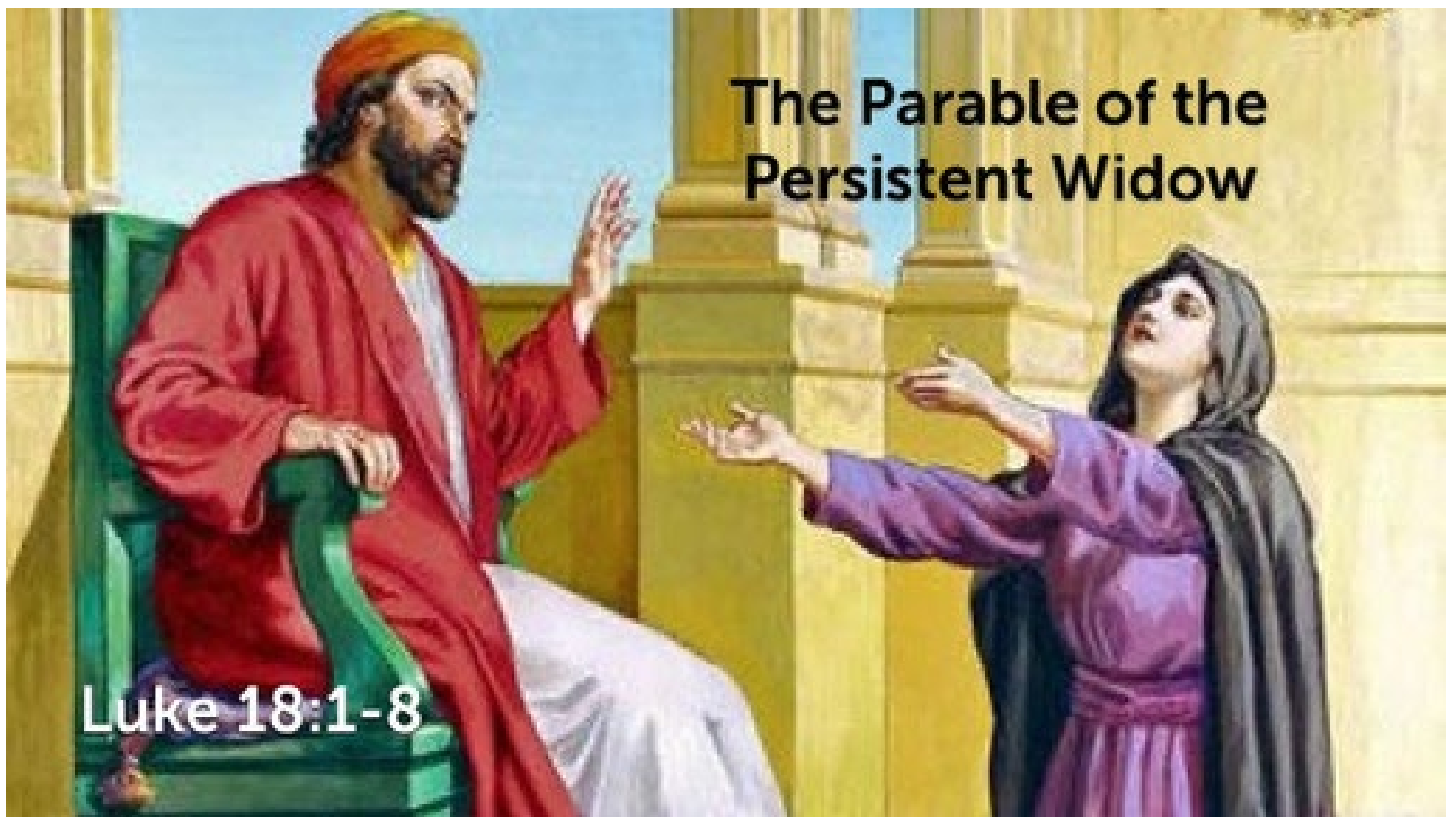

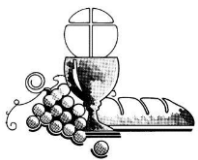

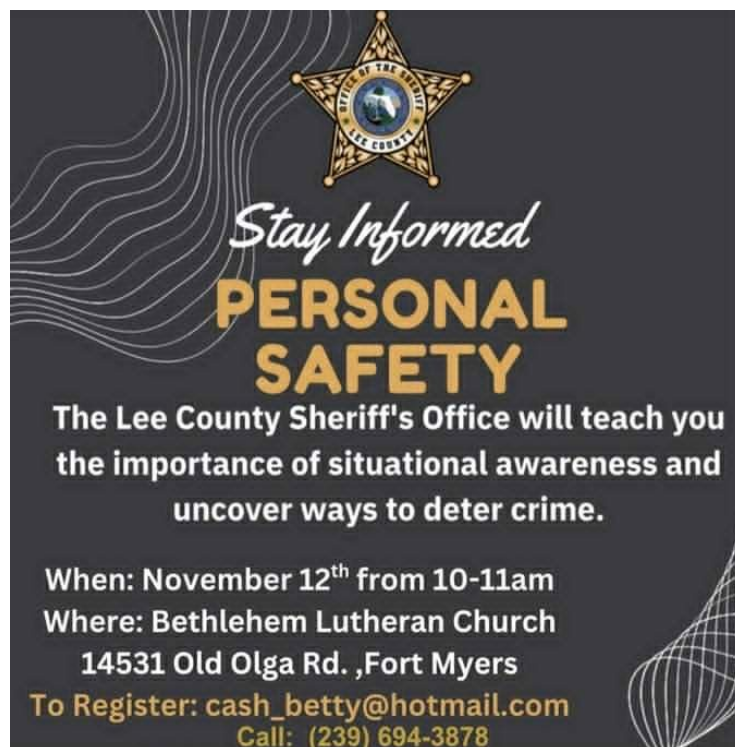


HOLIDAY FOOD BASKETS
